

GARFIELD RESIDENT PARKING PERMIT
RULES AND REGULATIONS

Any vehicle parked between the hours of 3:00 AM and 6:00 AM must have a Resident Parking Permit.

REQUIREMENTS

1. A valid New Jersey registration with a Garfield address
2. A valid New Jersey license of the registered owner of the vehicle with a Garfield address
3. Proof of residency (example: cable bill, PSE&G, telephone bill, with family name, apartment lease)
4. Insurance card for leased vehicles
5. The police department must approve vehicles with a gross weight of 6,000 lbs or more listed on the registration
6. Residents with company vehicles must obtain a notarized letter from the company they work for stating the employee is assigned that vehicle.

All requirements must be met each time applying for a resident parking permit

Resident parking permits cannot be switched from car to car.

Vehicles with more than (2) axles or more than (4) wheels touching the ground on any street do not qualify for resident parking permits.

New residents can apply for temporary permits if address is not changed on license and registration but still must provide proof of residency. Address changes can be made by calling DMV at 1-888-486-3339, logging on to www.njmvc.gov, or in person at any DMV office.

New cars with temporary license plates do not require a resident parking permit until a new registration is issued.

Occasional visitors may obtain an overnight courtesy by telephoning the Garfield Police Station 973-478-8500 and reporting their license plate number and street parked on.

Residents using a rental car for (1) week or more may apply for a temporary permit submitting the rental agreement, license, and proof of residence. If less than (1) week please call the Garfield Police Station 973-478-8500 every evening parked on the street and report license plate number and street parked on.

If at any time you must park a vehicle on the street overnight that does not have a resident parking permit on it you must call the police station 973-478-8500 for an overnight courtesy.
