CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS

Mr. Charles Nemeth, 12A Jewell Street, said that he is requesting pedestrian signs between the YMCA at 33 Outwater Lane to Jewell Street and the restriping of the road. He said that the signs on Jewell Street between Outwater Lane and Columbus Avenue say no parking from 12:00 PM to 4:00 PM but the rest of the signs on Jewell Street from Columbus Avenue to Lanza Avenue say no parking from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM He said that vehicles still go up Jewell Street the wrong way, on the one way.

Mr. Angel Quiles, 95 Willard Street, thanked the City Council for the Police presence in his neighborhood to deter any bad element. He spoke about the Veterans Day Services to be held on November 11th at 6:00 P.M. at the VFW at 340 Outwater Lane.

Mr. Anthony Erekat, 30 Pacific Avenue, spoke on people in Garfield receiving temporary “parking passes” for three months. He said that there are mattresses on the floor and he said that the owner of the house should provide off street parking for his tenants. He said that the City should check the handicapped parking spaces on Pacific Avenue and the City should be charging for temporary parking stickers.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Calandriello said that the work PSE&G has been doing is winding down. He said that he has been driving around town and he said that it is becoming more normal again. He said that River Drive and Outwater Lane have to be opened up. He spoke about the fire on Sunday, October 25, 2015 where 16 people were displaced. He said that the Garfield PBA really stepped up.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

He said that people were bringing clothes, food, gift cards and he was impressed by the great response from the town. He said that it gives him a good feeling being from the City of Garfield.

Councilmember Aloia commended everyone who helped out at the fire on Jewell Street including all the volunteers and paid fire companies from eight or nine towns, OEM Personnel, Ambulance, DPW, the City Manager, the DPW Superintendent and he thanked everyone. He said that although property was lost, but thank God, no lives were lost.

Councilmember Delaney said that the Mae & Ollies store on Jewell Street was in existence for many years. He thanked the Fire Department and how the City came together to help those who were displaced. He said that Garfield is a good place to live and it brings out the best of us. He said that he went to an event tonight entitled "Light the Night for Recovery" which is for recovering addicts, those with mental illness, heroin addicts and people with similar issues. He said that we are very fortunate after seeing what some people have to go through. He said that he is very appreciative for all he has. He reminded everyone that Election Day is Tuesday, November 3, 2015 and he said that many people have put their lives on the line for us to have that right.

Mayor Raymond said that the fire on Sunday was terrible. She said that no lives were lost and everybody did get out. She said, as in true Garfield fashion, the community came together including the Fire Department, the Police Department and the schools. She said everybody did pull together and the City is not done. She said that Garfield people have good hearts and that is what makes this town special. She spoke about shredding day which was held last Saturday for citizens to bring papers they want shredded and she spoke on the proposed Gang Task Force.

ADJOURNMENT

At 9:20 PM, there being no further business, Councilmember Aloia moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilmember Calandriello duly seconded the motion.
