Mr. Richard Rigoglioso, 13 Summit Avenue, spoke against a proposed cross walk from the Middle School to Momma Mia's Pizzeria located across the street.

Mr. Anthony Erekat, 30 Pacific Avenue, spoke on handicapped parking spaces. He said that there are too many spots in town. He claimed that there are too many illegal apartments in town and he said there are too many illegal students in town. He said that the temporary parking passes issued are out of control.

Councilmember Calandriello said that tomorrow's Veterans Day ceremony to be held at 11:00 AM at the VFW on Outwater Lane is always a great event to attend. She said that Garfield is a great place to live and the Council is going to make it better because this stuff will not be tolerated. She said that she was invited to speak before the Psychology Students at Garfield High School and one of the things they did was thank the City for trying to remove the bad kids from the streets. She said that there is a need to start televising the Council meetings. She reminded everyone that Veterans Day is tomorrow and she said that the Blue Star Kids will be there and there is a need to honor our brave warriors. She spoke on the Interfaith Thanksgiving Mass scheduled to be held at Our Lady of Mount Virgin Church at 188 Mac Arthur Avenue on November 18, 2015.
