SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

City Engineer Kevin J. Boswell reported on the \$280,000.00 grant for Safe Routes to Schools and \$326,000.00 bid that was received on October 15, 2016. City Manager Thomas J. Duch convinced the Board of Education to secure the difference in the money. The low bidder was told that they would be awarded the job but the low bidder said that they cannot do the job. The next low bidder was over \$400,000.00 so the recommendation is to reject all these bids and rebid the project.

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and to expand existing programs; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

WHEREAS, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for such tonnage grants for the calendar year 2016 will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Garfield City Council to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

WHEREAS, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.

WHEREAS, this Plan will provide a uniform procedure for the coordination of the requesting, dispatching, and utilization of law enforcement personnel and equipment whenever a local law enforcement agency requires mutual aid assistance from any other jurisdiction, both contiguous and non-contiguous, in the event of an emergency, riot or disorder, in order to protect life and property, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Mayor and Council of the City of Garfield to participate in a Mutual Aid Plan and Rapid Deployment Force in accordance with the Plan as submitted by the Bergen County Police Chief’s Association.
