WATER TESTING AND WATER QUALITY

The City Council and Cabinet discussed the following proposed reverse 9-1-1 call to City residents: This is City Manager Tom Duch with an important announcement concerning our water supply system. The water department has received test results that exceed NJ state standards for a specific compound at one city well site. While the NJ Department of Environmental Protection has determined that the well could remain in service the Mayor and Council have directed the immediate shut down of the well in question. In the next couple of days, you will receive a post card advising of this exceedance. The Mayor and Council have implemented a corrective action plan to address this matter. This includes the shutdown of the well and the installation of a treatment system to insure compliance with all NJ and Federal drinking water standards. The removal of this well from service means that all water reaching you remains safe for your use and consumption. Rest assured the mayor and council are committed to protecting the health of its residents as its first priority. Thank you and good night.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING STREET CLOSURES FOR MOUNT VIRGIN FESTA ITALIANA

WHEREAS, Our Lady of Mount Virgin Parish, located at 188 MacArthur Avenue, Garfield, New Jersey has, for several years, sponsored its Festa Italiana in honor of Our Lady of Mount Virgin; and WHEREAS, the Governing Body has, in the past, granted approval to Our Lady of Mount Virgin Parish to close certain streets during the time period within which the feast was going to take place; and

WHEREAS, the Festa Italiana has been conducted, in the past, with great success but the experience of the past several years has resulted in careful consideration of certain conditions which shall be imposed upon the approval for this year; and

RESOLUTIONS

WHEREAS, the Parish has now requested permission to conduct its annual Festa Italiana from Thursday, August 11, 2016 through Sunday, August 14, 2016 ; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 106 of the Code of the City of Garfield provides charitable organizations with the authority to conduct such activities with whatever reasonable conditions and approvals are required; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has reviewed the requests received from Our Lady of Mount Virgin Parish and has heard a presentation of representatives of the Parish and subsequent meetings with the members of the Parish and City Officials and has determined that it would be in the best interests of the City to once again grants such approval with certain conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Garfield, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. Our Lady of Mount Virgin parish is hereby granted approval to conduct its annual Festa Italiana commencing Thursday, August 11, 2016 through Sunday, August 14, 2016; and
2. The following street closures shall be permitted:
  - a. Frederick Street from Harrison Avenue to MacArthur avenue;
  - b. MacArthur Avenue from Frederick Street to Charles Street;
  - c. Charles Street from Harrison Avenue to MacArthur Avenue.
3. The street closures shall commence on Wednesday, August 10, 2016 at 8:00 AM and shall end no later than 11:59 PM on Sunday, August 14, 2016 however, there shall be no parking on said streets commencing on Wednesday, August 10, 2016 at 8:00 AM.
4. Our Lady of Mount Virgin Parish and the Feast Committee shall take any reasonable steps and precautions necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the city of Garfield and shall, additionally, take any reasonable precautions which are available to them in order to minimize any adverse effects on parking and traffic congestion in the area.
5. The Parish shall provide, to the City Manager, prior to commencement of the Feast, a Certificate of Insurance which shall name the City of Garfield as well as its agencies, departments and officials as additional insured for liability purposes.
6. The Police and Ambulance Corps will be assigned an area where a mobile command center will be located.
7. The sponsoring organization shall be fully responsible for the “proofing” of individuals who purchase beer and wine and the organization shall also be responsible for determining the age of individuals who access the segregated area within which beer and wine sales will take place. The Police Department shall assign a Police Officer to the area who will attempt to insure that no alcoholic beverages are consumed in any area other than the segregated area described in the Resolution.
8. Some of the food stands will also be moved to the interior of the church parking lot.
9. In the area where the streets are closed, regulated access will be instituted with a checkpoint to gain entrance to the feast area.
10. A 16 foot emergency lane will be maintained on the westerly side of MacArthur Avenue.
11. There shall be no rap or hip hop bands or rap/hip hop DJs permitted.

RESOLUTIONS

- 12. Sale of alcoholic beverages will stop one (1) hour before the Festival closes for the night.
- 13. A representative of the Parish shall contact resident homeowners on MacArthur Avenue in order to attempt to address any other concerns that they may have.
- 14. The parish will offer residents on MacArthur Avenue the right to park in a lot used by the church and owned by Dr. LaBarbera in order to minimize any inconvenience that may be caused.
- 15. The site plan shall be in the form attached hereto.

CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS

Ms. Ruth Springer, 139 Jewell Street, President of the Garfield Free Public Library Board of Trustees, asked questions concerning capital improvements to the Garfield Free Public Library Building located at 500 Midland Avenue.

Ms. Bonita Allen and Clair Logan, 316 Malcolm Avenue, both spoke on the need for the placement of a street light on a pole in their neighborhood.

Ms. Gracie Williams, 125 Gaston Avenue, spoke on the City Recycling employees and complained about the City Street Sweeper.

Mr. Everett Garnto, 51 Jewell Street, commended City Manager Duch and the entire Mayor and Council on the Municipal Budget that was introduced this evening. He commended City Engineer Kevin J. Boswell on his response and recommendations concerning the City Water from Well 1A and he commended the Mayor and City Council for shutting down Well 1A.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Calandriello spoke on the funding to the Garfield Free Public Library. He said that a \$6.7 million dollar surplus is a very good number and the City Bond Rating is very good. He said that the City is utilizing \$3 million dollars of the surplus in the Budget and is granting the taxpayers relief along with the redevelopment bringing in ratables. He spoke on the water notice that went out to the public regarding a high reading of one chemical and the immediate shut down of the Well 1A near the intersection of Outwater Lane and Midland Avenue.

Councilmember Aloia said that City water is good to drink but it could be better. He said that unfortunately when you are drawing water that brings a contaminant in, and even though it is below a level to be harmful, a notice and reverse 9-1-1 call went out with the City being over cautious.

Deputy Mayor Mati said that he likes meetings like this honoring different groups of people. He said that it is important to bring notice to people. He said that it brings honor to the City to honor people. He said that it is our chance to give thanks to you.

Mayor Raymond said that on April 12, 2016 the City will be renaming a part of a street after John Logan.
