PROPOSED TEMPORARY POLICE STATION

The City Council and Cabinet met with the following members of the Police Department concerning the proposed location of a Temporary Police Station at the old Latin Percussion site located at 160 Belmont Avenue and the intersection of Spring Street: Police Officer-in-Charge Police Captain Raymond Kovach, Police Captain Ronald Polonkay, Police Sergeant Michael Marsh and Police Officer Dennis Serritella. City Manager Duch reported that the initial rent to the City would be \$8,800 a month and \$9,000 a month the second year, not including utilities. A slide show was presented. City Manager Duch reported that the site has 23,000 square feet and it may cost the City approximately \$100,000 to get the Building into working condition for the Police Department.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION OF A FRONT END LOADER AND TWO DUMP TRUCKS, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, FOR THE USE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS IN, BY AND FOR THE CITY OF GARFIELD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$515,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS

City Clerk Pavlica read the ordinance by title.

Councilmember Mati moved that this ordinance entitled: “BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION OF A FRONT END LOADER AND TWO DUMP TRUCKS, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, FOR THE USE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS IN, BY AND FOR THE CITY OF GARFIELD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$515,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS” do now pass on first reading and remain on file with the City Clerk for public inspection until public hearing thereon and further consideration thereof which shall be held September 20, 2016 at 8:00 PM in the City Hall in Garfield and that the City Clerk be directed to publish said ordinance in full together with the notice of such hearing in The Record, at least seven days prior to the hearing.

The motion, duly seconded by Councilmember Aloia, was on roll call adopted by the following vote and the motion was declared adopted and said ordinance passed on first reading: Ayes 4, Nays 1 – Councilmember Delaney.

CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS

Mr. Anthony Morales, 90 Passaic Street, praised the DPW on collection of garbage on Passaic Street. He said that the transfer station has had no odors recently which is a good thing. He said that PSE&G is working with the people. He asked about the Redevelopment Plan of the First Ward. He spoke on the resolution awarding the Recycling Contract.

Mr. Angel Quiles, 95 Willard Street, spoke on the need to knock down old Fire House No. Three located at 58 Willard Street. He questioned the City's plan for the property. He said that the First Ward needs a park. He asked if the City would have a joint commemoration with the Middle School at 1:30 PM on Friday, September 9, 2016 because Sunday marks the 15th Anniversary of September 11th. He spoke on VFW Comedy Night scheduled to be held on September 23, 2016.

Mr. Jesus Rodriguez, 149 Midland Avenue, asked about the 100th Anniversary of the City of Garfield which will be celebrated in 2017. He asked questions about a proposed ordinance regulating turns from Commerce Street onto Midland Avenue by trucks. He spoke on the construction of a new public school at the intersection of Passaic Street and Marsellus Place. He asked questions on the proposed Redevelopment Plan of the First Ward. He spoke on the need for a street light at or near 151 Midland Avenue. He complained about the Transfer Station located at 19-35 Atlantic Street.

Mr. Mario Norcia, 520 Outwater Lane, complained about his taxes. He said that the City Manager and Deputy City Manager are overpaid because they did not help him to his satisfaction regarding a matter involving PSE&G. He complained about the City having too many cops.

Mr. Jerry Barrabas, 1 Garden Court East, spoke on the Eastern Overall/Sketchley Services site at the east end of Schley Street. He complained about dust being stirred up from the site by the contractors as they clean up the site.

Mr. Erol Sehovic, 162 Schley Street, spoke on the environmental cleanup of the Eastern Overall/Skechley Services site at the east end of Schley Street along the train tracks.

Mr. Noel Quiles, 20 Orchard Street, asked questions concerning an alleged chromium contamination at old Fire House No. Three located at 58 Willard Street.

Ms. Grace Barbaras, 1 Garden Court East, asked about the time table for the construction at the old Eastern Overall/Sketchley Services site. She complained about the vibrations and the shaking of her house due to the heavy equipment involved with the cleanup of the site. She complained about the dust from the site.

Mr. Robert Ridarick, 91 Belmont Avenue, spoke on PSE&G allegedly agreeing to pave Belmont Avenue from River Drive to Spring Street.

Mr. Gerald Walis, 77 Hartmann Avenue, spoke about the proposed ordinance concerning membership in the Fire Department and how he claimed that Fire Company No. Four never was presented with the ordinance prior to its introduction this evening.

Mr. Sean Delahanty, 15 Spring Street, spoke on the resolution authorizing the temporary location of the Police Department near the intersection of Belmont Avenue and Spring Street. He questioned the placement of a 24 hour operation into a residential area and he spoke about increased parking and traffic hardships in the area.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Calandriello spoke on Well 1A being reactivated. He spoke on the City Engineer obtaining records from the DEP about contamination and cleanup of the gas station that was at the southeast corner of the intersection of Outwater Lane and Midland Avenue. He spoke on the plan to obtain DPW equipment. He spoke on a summer jobs program. He spoke on the resolution awarding a contract for Recyclable Services. He spoke on the 15th Anniversary of the September 11th tragedy.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Aloia spoke on the Summer Job Program. He spoke on the acquisition of DPW Equipment. He spoke about Mr. Morales “taking possession” of Passaic Street. He spoke on the cleanup of Fire House No. Three and the plan to knock the building down. He said that if a park is established there, the park should be renamed in connection with September 11th.

Councilmember Delaney spoke on the acquisition of DPW equipment. He said that bucket loaders should last more than ten years. He spoke on the recyclable contract. He spoke on a Special Olympics resolution he would like to have for next meeting. He made a commitment to keep the City Council Election campaign clean.

Councilmember Mati spoke on running a clean campaign. He spoke on property maintenance issues and foreclosures. He spoke on the DPW cleaning up properties in foreclosure and putting a lien on the property. He spoke on the fifteenth anniversary of the September 11th tragedy. He said that he believes that the City of Garfield is heading in the right direction.

Mayor Raymond spoke on Veterans participating in the September 11th commemoration at the Middle School on Friday, September 9th. She spoke on the hardships the neighbors experience from the Solid Waste Transfer Station at 19-35 Atlantic Street. She spoke about honoring those Garfield citizens participating in the Special Olympics. She spoke on property maintenance issues. She spoke on Polish Night this coming Sunday. She spoke on the City collecting \$87,000 in illegal apartment fines. She spoke about illegal apartments.

ADJOURNMENT

At 10:50 PM, there being no further business, Councilmember Mati moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilmember Aloia duly seconded the motion.
