Regular Meeting Wednesday,
May 31, 2023

The regular meeting of Wednesday, May 31, 2023 was called to order at 7:00 PM by President, Raymond Rivas.

1. President Raymond Rivas asked for the Roll Call:

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

4. Communications:

Trustee Institute -Mary Jo reminded us of the upcoming (in-person) Trustee Institute scheduled for fall 2024.

United for Libraries Organization - The "United for Libraries Organization" group that we can join to network with library trustees across the country.

Trustee Orientation - This is being offered - focusing on the First Amendment to prepare trustees for anyone challenging our practices in the building,

Garfield City Council - At a recent council meeting the library pension was discussed. The City Manager/City Clerk stated that the CFO Hassler recently noted that the city has absorbed the employer pension costs for the library personnel for several years. Delaney suggested that this be charged to the library moving forward as they are a separate entity and should be treated as such. Additionally, she shared that the city's required contribution went up significantly this year, bringing the total to over \$1 million. The governing body supported this suggestion.

MaryJo reported that at the cocktail hour of the Library's Centennial Gala she heard that there is now a second rendition of what the Mayor wants to do the the block of building on Midland Avenue (library, health center, Boys and Girls Club, etc. ...creating one huge complex that is interconnected).

12. Health Benefits Deductions: Mary Jo Jennings reported that the health benefit deductions were corrected to date ...once she got the library attorney involved and they are now waiting for the union contract to be implemented, (agreed upon), and thus implemented before they do any increases related to health insurance deductions. MaryJo reminded the trustees to review the cba for any changes they would like to make.

NEW BUSINESS

13. Observance of Juneteenth (for purposes of contract) - Question is, “should we follow the federal or state practice?” Federal is roving like the July 4th holiday. The state of New Jersey it is the third Friday in June.

Motion made by Raymond to observe Juneteenth following the Federal guidelines and seconded by Ruth. Motion passed.

14. Reserved Bookshelf: Marie Marx asked if a bookshelf could be reserved for students working on a special project (local kid author shelf) that a teacher has established.

15. Rosetta Stone - Marie Marx inquired about how to access Rosetta Stone for a patron of ours who is originally from Albania. Per our website, it was available. (This was available through the state and was stopped at some point. Mary Jo will follow up on this. The state may have moved to a different language company. MaryJo will also have our website updated.)

16. Centennial Celebration for Community - June the 24th, for folks that could not pay the \$150 for the Gala. (Event to include stone painting, face painting, summer reading kick-off, egg races, tossing games, henna workshop, etc.)
